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### **Jonathan S. Yoder, Lead, Community Intervention & Critical Populations Task Force, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention**

Mr. Jonathan Yoder leads CDC's Community Interventions and Critical Population Task Force on the COVID-19 response. The Task Force works to develop COVID-19 guidance for community settings, understand effective personal prevention actions, and protect populations most at risk. In his non-response work, he leads water preparedness and response for the Division of Foodborne, Waterborne, and Environmental Diseases at CDC.

### **Shannon Stokley, DrPH, Vaccine Task Force, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention**

Dr. Shannon Stokley has over 20 years of experience conducting health services research to improve vaccination coverage for children, adolescents, and adults. She joined CDC in 1996 as an epidemiologist and from 2006-2013 served as the lead for the Adolescent Vaccination Team. Currently, she serves as the Associate Director of Science for the Immunization Services Division within the National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Diseases and is co-leading the Program Development and Strategy Team within the Vaccine Taskforce at CDC.

### **Nick Lee, Deputy Assistant Secretary, Office of Planning, Evaluation, and Policy Development, U.S. Department of Education**

Mr. Nick Lee most recently served as a senior program officer at the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. While at the Gates Foundation, he focused on supporting grantee efforts to make public K-12 and higher education funding more adequate and equitable. Prior to this role, he completed his first federal government stint in civil service roles at the U.S. Department of Education and the Office of Management and Budget during the Bush-Cheney and Obama-Biden Administrations focusing on federal student aid programs.

**Clarence “CJ” Powell, Special Assistant, Office of Postsecondary Education, U.S. Department of Education**

Mr. CJ Powell most recently served as the higher education program analyst at The Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights and The Leadership Conference Education Fund. In this role, he staffed the higher education civil rights coalition, a table of more than 50 national civil rights and policy organizations. Mr. Powell began his career in education equity as a college adviser in the College Advising Corps, assisting students in rural North Carolina in planning their postsecondary lives. Following graduate school, he served as the founding director of college preparation for a new high school in Nashville, Tennessee. Mr. Powell holds a Bachelor of Arts in religious studies from the University of North Carolina and a Master of Science in higher education from the University of Pennsylvania.

**Antonio Boyle, Vice President of Strategic Enrollment and Student Affairs, Delaware State University**

Mr. Boyle has 23 years of enrollment management experience. Mr. Boyle previously served as vice president of Enrollment Management for Wiley College in Marshall, Texas. Prior to that, from November 2014 to March 2016 at Wilberforce University in Ohio, he served in a similar position initially and then was elevated to senior vice president of Enrollment Management and Student Services. From 1994 to 2014, Mr. Boyle held enrollment management leadership posts at Kentucky State University, South Carolina State University, Florida A&M University, and Alabama A&M University. Mr. Boyle has a Bachelor of Science degree in General Business (1990) and a Master of Business Administration (1998), both from Alabama A&M University. He has also earned certificates from the Management Development Program and Institute for Management and Leadership, both at Harvard University.

**Sharon Davis, PhD, Chief Critical Response Officer, Dallas College**
